A postural Support Seat is an adaptive, portable multi-positional seat with headrest, body harness and lower extremities supports for children with poor postural control. These seats are proposed to support an active, functional sitting position and avoid passive sitting.

The term DME is defined as equipment which, according to 42 CFR §414.202:

- Can withstand repeated use; i.e., could normally be rented and used by successive patients;
- Effective with respect to items classified as DME after January 1, 2012, has an expected life of at least 3
 vears:
- Is primarily and customarily used to serve a medical purpose;
- Generally, is not useful to a person in the absence of illness or injury; and,
- Is appropriate for use in a patient's home.
